

# Central swims to first in meet

Hinsdale Central's swimmers got a good look at some of the top swimmers in the state Tuesday.

Central flexed its swimming muscles well enough to pull a win over St. Charles and Glenbrook North. The final tally showed Central with 123, St. Charles 106 and Glenbrook North 57.

Central coach Carol Lambert considers St. Charles along with New Trier East as its major challengers to the state swim title, which Central won last year.

"It was good to have a meet like this," Lambert said. "We've got to swim against some good competition."

Although the final score put Central very much in the lead, the meet was close. After the backstroke event, with only two races left, Central held a slim 5-point lead over St. Charles.

Lisa Dunlap and Andrea Thomas, however, came through with a 1-2 in the breaststroke, followed by a 1-3 finish by Central's two free relays to ensure the brass ring would go to Central.

Other winners for Central were the medley relay (Kim Stevens, Dunlap, Jenny Bozich and Alexandria Zaleski), Marianne McCaw in the 200-yard freestyle, and Maribeth Malecki in the 100 back.

Malecki turned in 1:04.6 in the back,

her all-time best time in that event.

"She was so happy," Lambert said. "We were all happy. She had never beaten the girl before."

Malecki also took a second in the 200 free.

Central took first and second in the diving competition. Claudia Zimmel was first and swimmer-diver Sue Cribari was second.

Lambert will spend the next few weeks moving people around in events, trying to come up with the best possible combination.

"We have to go where we win the most points," she said. Lambert expects to continue to experiment at least until the top 10 times in the state become available the first week in October.

## Back pack

Hinsdale Central's cross country runners continue to cross the finish line in a nice little pack.

Only problem is - the pack is back too far.

Central lost a heart breaker to Hinsdale South Monday night.

"The girls thought they had won," coach Gail Avgeris said. "They thought South only had the first two runners,

when they really had one, two and three."

Central's pack crossed the finish line in order from fourth to eighth. Jane Johnston was first, in a time of 13:32. The rest of the girls were Michelle Predovic, Kim Yeutter, Kate Leatham and Sue Miller. All times were within .15.

Leatham was first across the finish for Central in last week's loss to Glenbard West. The rest of the top finishers were Yeutter, Johnston, Predovic and Karen Vaughn.

Central's runners desperately need a win, however, to boost their egos.

"I keep telling them not to worry, their times are improving," Avgeris said.

In fact, some of the newer members of the team are making fantastic progress. Laura McCain and Liane Kivela have dropped almost two minutes.

Central faces tough Downers North today, Sept. 18, and will run in the Mustang Invitational at Downers South Saturday.

## Doubles talent

Hinsdale Central tennis coach Jerilyn Krizka has so many talented doubles

players that she feels she probably could come up with three top state teams.

Central won the New Trier West Invitational last week largely on the efforts of its doubles teams. The final score was Central 19, New Trier 14, Lake Forest 11 and Libertyville 3.

None of the four doubles teams lost a match in the four-team meet. Krizka teamed up Anne Hutchens with Margaret Hopkins, Sarah Hood with Kim Cushing, Caroline Barclay with Amy Issleib and Mary Marchuk with Meg O'Brien. All won easily.

The singles players of Vicki Shields, Gillian Leonard, Courtney Tews and Kathy Bouchard had problems with individual players.

Krizka has been filling the top singles and doubles slots with combinations of Shields, Hutchens and Hopkins. "Each will get one big match and some conference play," she said.

Hopkins was at first singles in last week's rout over Downers North, and Hutchens was the No. 1 singles in last night's dual meet with Homewood-Flossmoor.

Central is away at three conference meets this week. It plays at York today, Sept. 18, at Riverside-Brookfield on Tuesday, Sept. 23, and Proviso West on Thursday, Sept. 25.
