Here's the score:
Eileen Slowikowski, a senior at Hinsdale South, and Eddie Slowicowski, a junior, wave goodbye to their folks each morning and run to school.
Their parents then return to the breakfast table for one last cup of coffee and drive to work.
Erase that scene. It's not like that at all. Here's the way it really is: Norb and Mary Jane Slowikowski, proponents of positive thinking, are up at dawn's early light, running at $6 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. to an occasional bark of a dog. When they return, Eileen is just getting up. Eddie? He has turned over for another 15 minutes of shuteye.
No, it's not until afternoon when Eileen and Eddie get into high gear. And when they do, watch out, world.
Eileen Slowikowski is the best fernale middle and distance runner South has had. Eddie Slowikowski is the best male distance runner. Each is on a team that has state aspirations, especially Eddie's, which is raniked fourth in the state.
In real life, Eileen and Eddie are opposites.
Eileen plays it straight in school.
Eddie answers to Slackman "Lor my great ability to slack off." He was grounded for a weekend for being a "disruptive force" in the classroom. Nothing felonious, mind you. Just mischievous.
Eileen ran throughout the summer, attending a cross-country camp at the University of Illinois.
Eddie put off his running until the end of summer.
Their only similarity on the course is getting out in front and staying there. Otherwise, Eileen runs scientifically and Eddie "just runs."
But don't think for one moment they don't like each other or that Eddie Slowikowski is a total goof-off. He may call himself "weird" and Eileen may agree, but everyone who has seen Eddie run knows the slight ( 100 pounds) but muscular ( 15 chin-ups with ease) young man is very talented, very determined and very much like his father.

Norb Slowikowski, you see, was running the mile for Loyola University in 4 minutes, 12 seconds back when $4: 30$ was considered fashionable. The desire to run forever burns within him and he's proudly has passed it down to his children, particularly Eddie.
"They tell me he was a great runner, and I have to believe them because he has all those medals," Eddie said.
"Unfortunately, I took some of them to school in the fourth grade and lost' 'em.

"He's always on me about running. He got me started in the third grade. He didn't want me to ride the bus, so instead, I raced it. I'd wait until it started up, then I'd run to the next stop. I never won, but I came close a few times. My friends were in the bus cheering.
"Dad used to make me get up at 5:30 to
un with him in a park. He always beat me, and a lot of times I'd cry. But finally, in the fifth grade, I beat him. He was pretty mad.
"He comes to all our races. He's always honest. He tells me if I run a good race, and he lets me know when I run a dumb one."

Most of the time Eddie Slowikowski runs smart. He goes out fast, but saves a little extra for opponents who sneak up to challenge. Then . . . whoosh! He's gone.
"I get too worried if I sit behind people," he said.
He sat way behind people at the St. Charies Invitational in early September, finishing 21st. He traced it to stomach cramps from drinking water on a humid day before the meet.
"I'll never do that again," he said.
He has finished out of first place only once since.
Eileen's forte is the 800 meters in track. She was fourth in state as a sophomore and third as a junior.
But she never gives up in cross country, even though she has yet to beat last year's champ, Shelly McBride, and the brilliant Melissa Strasser, who won the mile and two-mile last spring as a freshman.

Perhaps if Eileen had started a little earlier...
"I always enjoyed watching my brother rum cross country, but didn't try it myself until my sophomore year."
Eddie interjected, "I kept getting on her about it. I didn't think it was fair that I had to do it, but she didn't."
Eileen continued, "I like it a lot; I clicked with it right away."
She clicked, all right, finishing 16th in state that year. But a nightmare came her junior year when, after winning district and rounding the first turn of sectional in first place, she psyched herself right out of qualifying.
It was one of those nightmares we all have where we're running from something evil, but not getting anywhere.
${ }^{r}$ It was awful. People started passing me and I kept thinking, 'You're nervous ... you're nervous.' Then I'd say, 'Oh, come on. You're not THAT nervous. You can catch up.' But I couldn't. My legs got really heavy. I wanted to drop out, but I wouldn't let myself. I got sick at the end of the race, then had to watch the awards ceremony. I watched people I'd beaten going to state, and I wasn't.
"Like I said, it wes awful."
Eileen Slowikowski has grown a lot since then. No more psych-outs.
Going to camp helped. She learned tactics, pacing, uphill training, proper foods and, perhaps most important, to think positively. As a reminder, she has a chart hanging from a bedroom wall. It's 10 do's and don'ts of cross country.
Now when Norb Slowikowski tells his offspring what they did and did not do during a race, they understand.
