Hornet, Devil runners start strong

The Red Devil/Hornet Girls Cross Country Invitational turned out to be quite a spectacle as Hinsdale Central and South finished second and third out of 10 teams.

Not a bad showing for the Devilettes who took second with 65 and Hinsdale South with 76, the lower the total the better. Naperville Central took top honors with 51.

For the Devilettes it was a move in the right direction from a team that became the first Central team to advance to the state meet last year.

The Hornettes didn't do too badly either, considering they lost two of their better runners of a year ago in Eileen Slowikowski and Sally Kurth.

But this day definitely belonged to Lynne Segreti of the Devilettes, who finished first at the Katherine Legge Park course in 11:41. "I didn't expect to run such a good time. This course has more hills, and in the second mile alone you have about three. I had only run this course once before, so it was pleasing to come in with such a good time."

Segreti's coach, Gail Avgeris, was in total agreement. "I thought Lynne (Segreti) looked just super. She had the race to herself. It was amazing she ran as fast when she didn't have anybody pushing her."

The Devilettes did place four more runners in the top 25 in Melanie Bui who took ninth in 13:05, Casey Blough in 14th in 13:31, Heather Barrow in 19th in 13:40 and Suzie Sutor in 22nd in 13:50.

"I was really pleased to have that many in the top 25," Avgeris said. "It was a good way to start the season. We did an excellent job of closing the time spread between our runners. In the past we spread it out too fast."

The Hornettes didn't do badly either. They placed four runners in the top 20. Kerri Faber finished 10th in 13:09.4, Karen Verdak placed 11th in 13:13.5, Sandy Plasek a 12th in 13:26.6 and Kim Erickson a 15th in 13:31.9.

"To be honest with you I had no idea what

to expect from this race," Hornette coach Mike Madsen said. "We still have some things to work on and some question marks to solve, but for the most part I think we are on the right track."

Madsen was particularly pleased with another girl, Dawn Kristola, who came in 28th with a time of 14:16.4 and Erickson. "Dawn (Kristola) ran in her first race and I thought she did well. Kim (Erickson) didn't run well in an earlier meet, but came back strong on Saturday."

Avgeris also had a girl who did really well for the first time out in Sutor, a freshman, who finished 22nd.

"She has a great attitude and to win a medal your first time out is a real thrill," Avgeris said.

Segreti holds the record on the old course of 11:27. "I have been running during the summer to keep in shape. I also have developed some new techniques in my running. One of the things I don't want to happen is push myself too soon and burn out," Segreti added.

Madsen was surprised that Naperville Central would be that strong. "They proved better than I thought they would be." Madsen was equally impressed with the turnaround in times of his girls from an earlier meet.

The Hornettes against Lake Park had 21 to Lake Park's 40. Although they won easily, Madsen didn't feel the gap between times was that good. "There was too much of a time spread on the first two runners and 5 through 7. We did dominate but Lake Park didn't exactly push us that much," Madsen added.

Faber took second in 14:31, Verdak a third in 14:55, Plasek a fourth in 14:56, Erickson a fifth in 16, Jackie Smalley a seventh in 16:51, Kristi Kufta an eighth in 16:54, Pat Barera a ninth in 17:03, Nancy Seddon a 10th in 17:09 and Tracy Mondak an 11th in 17:32.

"If we can continue to close the gap in

times we should all right," Madsen said. "Our running really improved between those two meets. I think we are in pretty good shape."

Avgeris, whose team ran for the first time in the Red Devil/Hornet Invitational, wasn't all that surprised at the early season success.

"I really wasn't surprised. I thought both of us would be right at the top. All I want to see is us stay consistent and keep improving our times."

Redwings slip past Hornets

Patty Berigan's time of 17:40 in Tuesday's double dual meet in Lisle did not exactly break any course records, but the Benet Academy harrier wound up being the difference in her school's victory over Hinsdale South.

The Hornets and Redwings, both of which defeated Driscoll handily, tied for first at 28-28, but on the tiebreaker system, Berigan edged out Hinsdale South's sixth runner, Tracy Mondek, to give Benet the win.

Kathleen Jamieson (15:37) and sister Bridget (16:11) finished second and fifth, respectively, to pace Benet. Kim Marker was sixth in 16:18, Diane Bukant seventh in 16:26, and Andrea Faeh eighth in 17:15. Berigan was 11th.

For Hinsdale South, Carrie Faber won the race in 15:17, Karyn Verdak was third in 15:56, Sandy Plasek fourth in 16:00, Dawn Kristola ninth in 17:16, and Jackie Smalley 12th in 17:48. Mondek was 13th in 17:59.

The Redwings were 15-47 winners over Driscoll, while Hinsdale South took the Highlanders 16-47.

Both teams will compete in invitationals today. Benet is at Kankakee, while Hinsdale South travels to Reavis.

Last Saturday, Benet had four runners in the top 10, but had to settle for second place in the Plainfield Invitational. The host school won with 42 points and the Redwings notched 49. Lisle tied for third.

Kathleen Jamieson was fifth in 17:04, Marker sixth in 17:17, Bukant eighth in 17:27, Bridget Jamieson 10th in 17:53, and Faeh 20th in 19:04.

Hornettes still need to sharpen act

It's still early in the season, but Hinsdale South girls cross country coach Mike Madsen sees a lot of room for improvement.

The Hornettes ran into a jigsaw on Monday, losing to Downers Grove South and Willowbrook. The Hornettes had 51 points to the Warriors' 50 and the Mustangs, who won the triangular with 27 points.

"DGS proved to be as tough as I expected," Hornette coach Mike Madsen said after the meet. "They have a nice group that run very tightly together. There isn't much of a spread between them. It shows we still have some work to do."

The Hornettes did manage to place all seven of their girls in the top seven: Carrie Faber finished first at 12:26, Sandy Plasek took ninth in 13:16, Karyn Verdak placed 10th in 13:24, Jackie Smalley in 15th in 13:47, Kim Erickson in 20th in 14:05, Dawn Kristola in 21st in 14:12 and Tracy Mondek in 23rd in 14:22.

"We were hurt a bit by the fact that Kim (Erickson) ran for the first time in a week because she was sick, plus it's so hard to come back and run competitively."

"One of the biggest surprises has been Sandy (Plasek). Her attitude has been great and she has been running very efficiently. She has a very positive outlook."

In a dual meet with Benet and Driscoll, the Hornettes split. Benet won because its sixth runner had a better time than the Hornettes did. At the completion of the meet they were tied at 28-all.

But the Driscoll meet was a different story, as the Hornet girls won 16-47. Faber

came in first with a time of 15:17, Verdak in third at 15:56, Plasek in fourth in 15:59, Kristola in ninth in 17:15, Smalley in 12th in 17:47 and Mondek in 13th in 17:58.

"Losing on that tie breaker really hurt because if Kim (Erickson) had run I believe we would have done better. The problem in this meet is the girls let the rest of the pack get too much of a lead. Right now there is an excellent competition for the 6 and 7 positions," Madsen said.

As for the Bloom Invitational on Saturday, Sept. 22, "I don't know much about those teams," Madsen said. "We won there a few years ago, but what I'm concerned about is bringing the girls' times closer together. In the past we have been strong at the beginning. This year I believe we have to show more improvement as we go along. All I can say is don't give up on us yet."

Conference meet awaits Hornettes

At the Rich Central Invitational, the Hornette runners got a superb performance from Faber, who finished third in a time of 12:32 to spur the Hornette team to third place.

"Carrie (Faber) ran the best race yet this year," Madsen said. "The kind of performance she gave is what we will need come Saturday."

Verdak was 11th in 13:03; Erickson, 23rd at 13:34; Plasek, 37th at 13:55; Smalley, 42nd at 14:05; Noelle Cooper, 55th at 14:40 and Mondek, 65th at 15:06.

"Jackie (Smalley) this year finished 19 places higher than last year," Madsen said. "When the weather gets cooler it's to her advantage."

In open-race results Christie Kufra ran in a time of 14:54; Pat Barrera, 15:20 and Rachel Doepke, 16:31. All three girls finished in the top 20, which earned them ribbons.

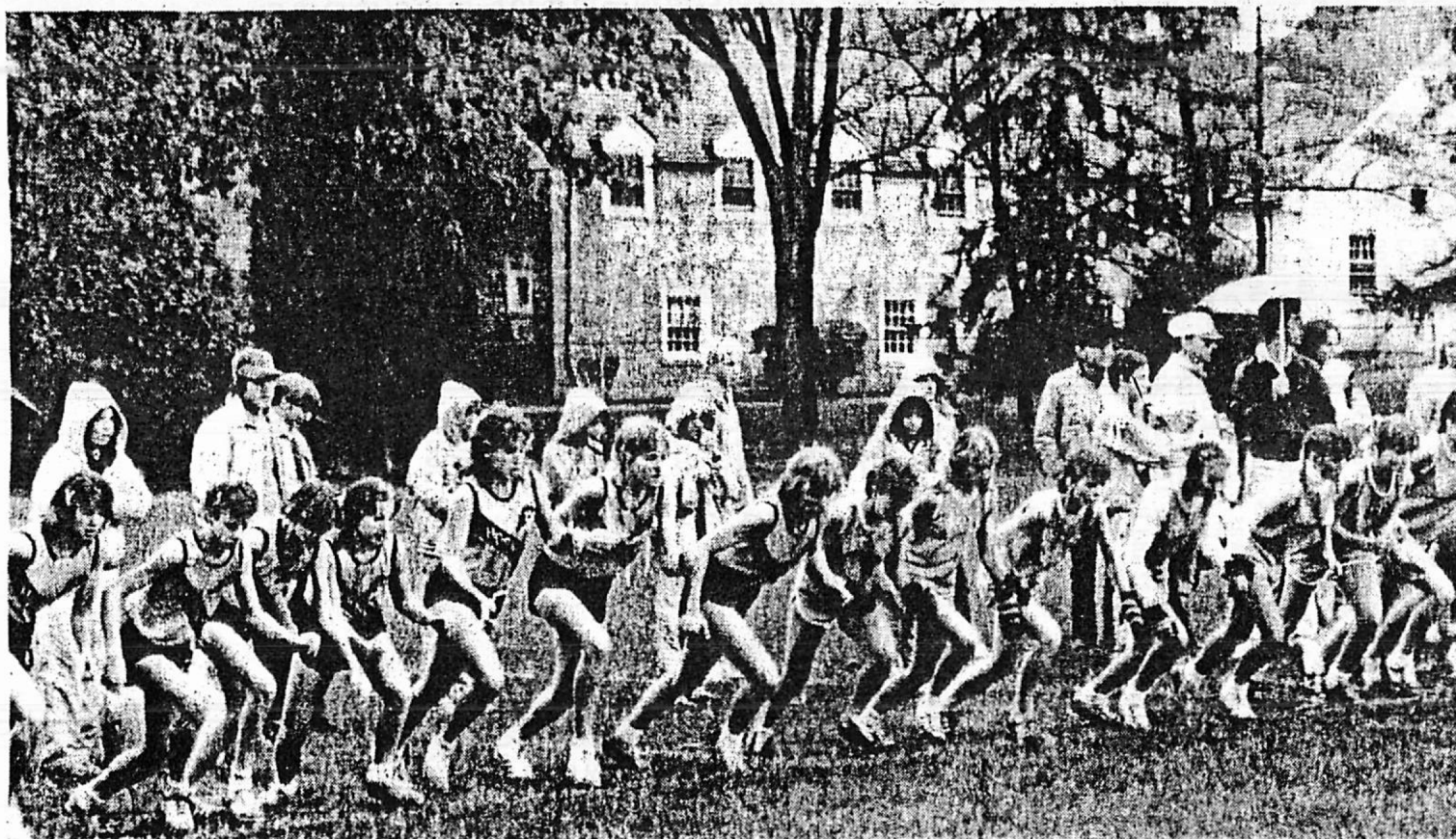

31st with a 13:01 and Kim Erickson took 35th with a 13:06. Teammate Jackie Smalley ran a 13:22 for 44th, while Noelle Cooper finished 61st in 14:08.

Tracey Mondek and Pat Barrera ran to 74th and 79th with a 14:55 and a 15:21.

"Three or four girls ran significantly slower than in the conference meet and that killed us," Madsen said.

"The season began as a question mark, because a few good runners graduated. We developed gradually and just kept improving. The girls worked and got along well with each other all season," Madsen added.

"That was the reason for my optimism going into the regionals."

Commenting on the season, the coach explained that one of the two goals was reached this year. They did make second place in conference. The other goal included team action at the sectionals.
