

# Injuries hampering South runners

The Hinsdale South girls' cross country program has

been a model of success over the years.

Ever since 1980 when the program first started, the Hornettes have been consistent performers and have had a few top-notch runners, including Anne Schuessler and Eileen Slowikowski.

But this year may be a little different. In fact, it may be the first time Coach Mike Madsen has had to use the word

"rebuilding."

The Hornette runners, who are coming off a secondplace finish in the Des Plaines Valley League, had a first occur last year when they had no representation at the state meet.

The prospect of that happening again is enlarged, since Madsen lost four of his top eight runners to graduation.

But the coach is hoping for the best.

"Right now our biggest problem has been early-season injuries," said Madsen, whose team opened the season Tuesday against Lake Park and Benet Academy. "We've been having a lot of knee type of problems. I guess you can say we're rebuilding. We don't have enough experience back."

Madsen's main concern centers around senior Kim Erickson, perhaps the team's best runner. She is out indefinitely with achilles tendinitis, and that puts a big dent in the Hornettes' chances of doing well as a team. She hasn't run much at all and is under orders not to run until the condition clears up.

That puts the load on the shoulders of junior Kerry

Faber, who gave South its best showing last season by running in the sectional. She will be joined by relative newcomers Noelle Cooper, Rachel Doepke, Tracy Mondek, Tina Pohl, Dawn Kristola, Cindy Schelthoff and Jamillah Morris.

Senior co-captain Pat Barrera and junior Nancy Seddon are the only other runners with much experience.

That makes it an uphill battle for the Hornettes against defending conference champion Downers Grove South, which also went to state last year.

"There's no question Downers South has to be the heavy favorite in the conference because they have everybody back," Madsen said. "Willowbrook also has a lot of talent back. But I hope we can continue our tradition of being in the top three in the conference."

A lot of those hopes will be based on whether Erickson can come back.

"She just can't do the things she's capable of doing right now," Madsen said. "It's a ashame because she was looking forward to having a good senior year. We'll just have to wait and see."

Meanwhile, Madsen will see how his relatively inexperienced team will fare in this Saturday's Hornet-Red Devil Invitational at Katherine Legge Memorial Park in Hinsdale starting at 9:30 a.m. There, South will be up against other girls' teams, including sister school Hinsdale Central.

After that, the Hornettes will prepare for their showdown with Downers Grove South on Monday, Sept. 9.



# Mustangs roll over Hornets, Blazers

Taking advantage of a crippled Hinsdale South team, Downers Grove South rolled over both the Hornets and Addison Trail Monday in a Des Plaines Valley League girls cross country meet in Downers Grove.

The Mustangs, who had five of the top six runners, scored 19 points to easily outdistance Hindale South (57) and the Blazers (62).

In a tight battle for individual honors, Downers South's Jenny Laske (12:59) outlasted Hinsdale South's Carrie Faber (13:04).

"She ran extremely well," said Hornet coach Mike Madsen of Faber. "That's more like how she should be running for us."

Finishing third through sixth in Mustang uniforms were Kim DeBuhr (13:19), Becky Mizener (13:20), Chris Slabich (13:28), and Robin Dziedzic (13:29)

For Hinsdale South, Noelle Cooper was 12th in 14:13, Tracy Mondek 15th in 14:37, Cindy Schelthoff 18th in

14:52, and Dawn Kristola 20th in 15:11.

Today, Downers South will be at the DeKalb Invitational, while the Hornets compete in the Reavis Invite.

"I was satisfied with what we did, considering the girls we had out," he said. "It's going to be slow going in the first half of the season with everyone we have out. It's a young group. If we can start hitting on all cylinders, I hope we can move up in the standings."

Madsen was without his best runner, senior Kim Erickson, who has tendinitis. Also not running were Pat Barrera and Nan-

cy Seddon. That forced Madsen to use younger runners against older, more experienced runners.

Finishing the best for South were Noelle Cooper and Kerry Faber, who placed 16th and 17th respectively with times of 14;08.3 and 14:13. Cindy Schelthoff was 20th in 14:29.5, and Jamillah Morris was 32nd in 15:17.4.

Morris gave Madsen and everyone a scare when she collapsed at the end of the chute. She suffered muscle strain but was OK later.

On Monday, the Hornet girls came in second in a conference meet with Downers South and Addison Trail. The scores were Downers Grove South 19, South 57 and Addison Trail 62.

Faber placed second with a time of 13:04 followed by Cooper in 12th in 14:13, Mondek in 15th in 14:36, Schelthoff in 18th in 14:52 and Dawn Kristola in 20th in 15:11.

At 10 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 14, both squads will be at the Reavis Invitational.

#### Cross country team plagued with injuries

If it's any consolation to Mike Madsen, he's not the only one having problems this season.

Madsen, whose Hinsdale South girls' cross country team has a case of the injury plague right now, can take heart in the fact that other teams also are having their share of injuries in the early season.

"I heard the other day that Glenbard West beat York but that York had four of their top seven runners out," Madsen said. "All we can do is keep going on and hope that by the end of the season we'll have everybody back healthy."

Last week the Hornette injury list grew by one more as sophomore Jamillah Morris went out with a strained muscle she got at the Hornet-Red Devil Invitational. It is not known when she will return.

That misfortune was offset by the return of Pat Barrera and Tina Kohl, who had been out with injuries but are back running. # Hornettes getting wounded back

Slowly but surely, Hinsdale South's girls' cross country team is getting back its walking wounded.

The Hornettes, who have been plagued all season with numerous injuries, are almost back at full strength, and not a moment too soon.

With less than half the season remaining and only two weeks before the conference meet, the Hornettes need everybody and anybody.

On Monday, South got two bodies back: Tina Pohl and Pat Barrera ran for the first time this season. They helped the Hornettes win a triangular meet with Willowbrook and Morton. South scored 25 points to Willowbrook's 33 and Morton's 81.

It was perhaps the best meet to date for the Hornettes, who recorded some of their best times and spaced themselves well. Coach Mike Madsen also was pleased to beat Willowhook, which had placed ahead of South at the DuPage County meet Saturday in Glen Ellyn.

"The difference between Saturday (where South placed 14th) and today (Monday) was like night and day," Madsen said. "The girls ran very well. It was our Parents Night, and they put on a good show. This was a real confidence builder today."

The meet also gave Pohl and Barrera some confidence as they ran competitively for the first time. The two girls were South's eighth and 10th runners respectively. Pohl finished 20th overall with a time of 14:57 as she ran in her first high school meet. Barrera was 24th with a time of 15:33.

"That was a good start for them having just come back," Madsen said.

Meanwhile, South had another runner come back: Dawn Kristola. She had missed the previous two meets because of a nagging injury. She finished sixth Monday with a career-best 13:54. On Saturday, she finished 83rd overall with a time of 15:04. "It's a big boost to have her back again," Madsen said.

Other top runners for South on Monday 12:33; Cindy Schelthoff (third, 13:31); Noelle Cooper (fourth, 13:37); Tracy Mondek (12th, 14:20); Rachel Doepke (15th, 14:35); and Sherry Hovorka (19th, 14:56).

Two freshmen, Angleique Drzick and Tracie Biehl, also did well. Drzick improved her time on the KLM course by almost three minutes. Biehl also went a season-best 16:15.

Almost everyone improved their times, including Schelthoff, who donned a pair of new spikes and finished ahead of Cooper for the first time.

"It gave her an edge or something, I guess," Madsen said.

Meanwhile, the Hornettes could have used an edge in Saturday's meet at Glen Ellyn. Running against some of the top teams in the area, including regional foes, South finished a dismal 14th, well behind the winning York team.

Finishing in order for South were Faber (38th, 14:07); Cooper (75th, 14:56); Kristola (83rd, 15:04); Scheltoff (101st, 15:26); Mondek (103rd, 15:32); Doepke (119th, 15:58); and Hovorka (126th, 16:33).

Madsen hopes that with the addition of the new runners and the possible return of senior co-captain Kim Erickson, the Hornettes will be a much-improved team come regional time.

"I was very frustrated after Saturday, but we rebounded today (Monday)," Madsen said. "We're starting to get people back to running, and the others are continuing to improve. Hopefully, we'll be ready for the conference and regional meets."

The Hornettes are slated to compete in two meets Saturday, Oct. 5. South is to compete in the big Niles West Invitational and in the Wheaton North Invitational. But a teachers' strike has put the Niles meet in jeopardy.

## Reckoning time for South runners

The time of reckoning has arrived for Coach Mike Madsen and his Hinsdale South girls' cross country team.

For Madsen, it is time to decide who will be his top seven runners for this Saturday's Des Plaines Valley League meet at Downers Grove South.

For the Hornettes, it is time to decide whether they want to be one of the top three teams in the conference, or just another also-ran.

South has always placed second or third in the conference meet, but it never has won. The chances of winning this time are again slim, but Madsen wants his charges to take aim at second.

"We have quite a group of girls who have made contributions along the way," Madsen said. "They all deserve to run, but only seven can."

Madsen got an idea of who might be able to do the job at last Saturday's Rich Central Invitational. He was able to run everyone in the regular race and in an open race afterward.

In the regular race, South finished seventh out of 15 teams with 163 points.

Finishing in order were Carrie Faber (19th, 14:00); Noelle Cooper (23rd, 14:09); Rachel Doepke (34th, 14:29); Cindy Schelthoff (38th, 14:36); Dawn Kristola (49th, 14:56); Tina Pohl (61st, 15:15) and Tracy Mondek (75th, 15:50).

For Faber, South's No. 1 runner all season, it was not one of her better performances.

Madsen was pleased with Cooper, who was able to earn a medal, and with Doepke, who ran one of her best races of the season.

In the open race, Kim Erickson turned in another strong performance as she placed fifth with a time of 15:02. It was only the senior's second run of the season, but she lowered her time.

"She's definitely on the comeback," Madsen said. "Her leg is not well yet, but she's definitely contending for one of those (seven) spots."

Sherry Hovorka and Nancy Seddon also ran well, finishing 12th and 15th respectively with times of 15:50 and 15:54.

While the top four spots seem secure in the form of Faber, Cooper, Doepke and Schelthoff, the final three spots are open between Kristola, Pohl, Mondek, Erickson, Hovorka and Seddon.

Slabich won the race with a time of 11:54, and not until 29 seconds later did another runner enter the chute. That was teammate Laurie Mizener (12:23), as Downers Grove South dominated the annual affair, scoring 21 points to runner-up Willowbrook's 64.

"I didn't really think that much about what our score would be," said Mustang coach Bruce Thornquist. "Our goal was to have five all-league runners and we got six. The girls were very confident, even though we were running without Robin Dziedzic, who has a stress fracture in her foot."

Slabich said the Mustangs felt the pressure of being expected to win, but responded well to it.

"It's scary, because if you don't win, then people start to wonder what's wrong," she said. "I love our course; it's excellent, it's the best one. I felt tired right away today, but I beat my (previous best) time by one second."

Following Slabich and Laurie Mizener for the Mustangs were Jenny Lasek, fourth in 12:32; Becky Mizener, sixth in 12:43; and Michelle Shotton, eighth in 12:55.

"Their times were slow compared to the Mustang Run (the previous weekend) because the ground was so soft," said Thornquist.

The Mustangs' sixth runner, who also made the all-league team, was Kim DeBuhr, who was ninth in 12:56.

Hinsdale South finished third with 80 points, putting together a solid pack.

"We had a real nice pack," said Hornet coach Mikde Madsen. "In fact, it was too close of a pack between Carrie (Faber) should have been up higher than she was.

"She was second last year in the conference, but she's been having a tough battle mentally lately. She was not running very well."

Faber wound up 12th in 13:08. The top five Hornet runners were within 32 seconds of each other and all seven finished within 46 seconds.



Madsen said he was not surprised at the ease with which Downers South won.


"There's a definite home course advantage here, but they're so much better than the rest of the conference that I don't think it was a factor," Madsen said.

made it tough."



## South's Faber

### returns to Twinkies

Hinsdale South — It doesn't really matter much to Hinsdale South coach Mike Madsen that Karrie Faber didn't qualify for the state tournament next week in Peoria.

What does matter is that she had been coming on strong towards the end of the season and had been getting down her times.

"I'm sure she hoped that she would make it to the state tournament," Madsen said. "But still, she ran quite well. I thought she finished up the season real well after having a slow start."

Faber finished the sectional in 35th place in a time of 12:49.8.

"That was a pretty tough sectional. There were some real good runners there and she finished ahead of a lot of the runners who had beaten her ealier in the year."

Downers South scored 103 points to take the team title. Also qualifying as teams for the state meet were Downers North, second with 123 points; Hoffman Estates, third with 134; Wheaton North, fourth with 135; and Naperville Central, fifth with 136.

Failing to qualify from the area were the Hinsdale Central team, 10th with 246 points, and individuals Susie Hooper of Lisle, 52nd; Carrie Faber of Hinsdale South, 35th in 12:49.8; and Amy Schaub of Benet Academy, 73rd in 13:20.4.

Carrie Faber can go back to eating her favorite snack food — Twinkies — at least until the track season starts.

Faber, who represented Hinsdale South last Saturday at the girls' sectional cross country meet at Katherine Legge Memorial Park in Hinsdale, failed to qualify out of the meet for this Saturday's state final in Peoria.

The junior finished 35th out of 160 runners, but she failed to earn an individual qualifying spot. Her time was 12:49.8 on a wet and slippery KLM course.

Just the week before, Faber ran a 12:42.2 on the same KLM course to be South's only qualifier out of the regional. At the time, she said she was going to go without the creamfilled Twinkies, which had been affecting her running.

Even though Faber didn't qualify for the state meet, South Coach Mike Madsen was glad to see his top runner end the season on the upbeat.

"She finished the season on a high note," Madsen said. "She finished well ahead of some runners who had beaten her at the conference meet and other big meets. She looked good in the early part of the year but then had a long slump. It was nice to see her bounce back at the regional and sectional."

Faber's performance mirrored that of the Hornette team. South started the season with several injuries, but it got almost everyone back for the conference meet. Madsen will lose only two regulars off his top seven runners: seniors Kim Erickson and Pat Barrera.

"If we can get these people back, and I hope some new ones, I think we'll be right back to being good again," Madsen said. "I'm hoping to have more than just Carrie next year."

HORNETTE STINGS ... DPVL champion Downers South won the sectional with 103 points, followed by Downers North (123), Hoffman Estates (134), Wheaton North (135) and Naperville Central (136). Next year the Hornettes might be running in a different format as the DPVL and West Suburban Conference are slated to merge. Currently, the DPVL does not count conference dual meets toward the conference standings; the WSC does.
