# Veteran lineup has Hornets seeking big goals

The Hinsdale South girls cross country team is big on talent, experience, enthusiasm and, yes, even numbers.

An impressive 25 girls turned out the first week this season — the most ever for 16th-year coach Mike Madsen — as the Hornets are determined to meet some lofty goals.

Seniors Christy Culen and Katie Moss, both fourth-year varsity runners, senior Jamie Bechina and sophomores Liz Duvall and Jenny Wiltjer also earned All-WSC Gold honors in 1995 by finishing among the top 16 at the conference meet.

Through the leadership of Moss, chosen last year's Most Valuable Runner, and Culen, the five became a strong pack with

quickly in her first cross country season.



# **Palatine** seeks to add to dynasty

First First First Second Second. Then, last year, first again. This fall, Palatine is favored to win the school's sixth cross country state title in

eight years. In 1989, the Palatine girls, gasping but grinning, reached the top of the hill for the

first time. Now they basically live there—in a nice red and white nylon tent with a pan-oramic view of the also-rans down below.

It wasn't easy reaching the peak. It is harder to stay there. Just ask Joe Newton, whose York teams have been dominating the boys landscape pretty much since 1962 (20 state titles).

By that standard, Palatine's girls' program
Is still York Light. But clearly, in a sport
where good teams reach the pinnacle only silde back down when their stars and chemistry move on, the Pirates are doing something right.

It all started in 1976. With an enthusiastic

bang.
"That first year," remembers former coach "That first year," remembers former coach Pat Gleason, who would later lead the Pirates to their first state title in 1999 and their second in 1990, "we had 35 girls show up the first day of practice. I didn't recruit any of them. We've never had a problem with numbers. Cross country seemed to catch on real quick. I can't really say why it did at Palatine. It wasn't that way at all schools."

Gleason and current coach Steve Currins, though, do have a number of theories on why the program has kept going and going and going strong.

Currins gives credit to Gleason's creativity and enthusiasm. Gleason mentions Cur-rins' dedication, follow-through and organization. And both give thanks for all the girls who have kept the motor humming.

"We didn't set out to pattern ourselves after York," says Gleason, "I know Joe. I have a lot of respect for his success. But we didn't copy York."

"Palatine's own map has followed at least seven main roads to success:

# South's Wenckus enjoys strong but wet racing debut

Hinsdale South senior Dalia Wenckus had little strategy for her first cross country race in Saturday's Hornet/Red Devil Invitational, except as she approached the creek at Katherine Legge Memorial Park.

Wenckus opted not to step off a big stone in the middle like many but rather to work off some smaller rocks to the right. Only a large group of spectators near that spot and apprehension altered

"I knew people would move, but I'm like, 'Oh well," Wenckus said. "(I took) two steps into the creek, and that was full water up the ankle. It was something I didn't even practice. I just got

Yet as she removed the soaked tape that secured her slightly sprained left ankle after the race, Wenckus couldn't have been much happier. She had just finished seventh and helped the Hornets take fifth as a team with an altered lineup

Senior Erika Coull-Parenty led the Hornets by taking fourth on the 2.0-mile course in 12 minutes, 20 seconds, followed by Wenckus (12:31), Christy Culen (16th, 12:58), Jamie Bechina (43rd, 13:51), Rose Deato (64th, 15:16), Tracy Amish (71st, 15:54) and Amy Dhaliwal (72nd, 16:15).

Returning starters Katie Moss, Purva Kelkar and Jenny Wiltjer did not compete for the Hornets (134 points). Moss and Kelkar were bothered by stiff legs, while Wiltjer, the Hornets' No. 2 runner in 1995, is out indefinitely with a back injury.

Coull-Parenty, a top 10 finisher at the Hornet/Red Invite all four years, didn't return to practice until Sept. 4-to rest a strained left knee

ligament.
"I have nothing to complain about, other than the fact that I want to get my people healthy and get the full lineup in," Hinsdale South coach Mike

Wenckus decided to join cross country this season after being on the swimming team. Although new to the sport, Wenckus is a two-time track alistater in the 800-meter run, including a seventhplace finish in May.

"I thought my best bet lay in running and I love running," Wenckus said. "It's something I'm good at so I wanted to do (cross country).

"I had no idea what to expect (today). Erika beats my butt in practice every day. She's one of the best so I was just here to run and help the team out. I want to win conference."

Coull-Parenty, third in the 1995 Hornet/Red Devil Invite, had hoped to win, but an impressive 11:34 by Bloomington sophomore Christin Wurth, second in Class AA last year for Normal, beat the field by 42 seconds. Coull-Parenty was edged at the finish line by Wheaton Warrenville South's Kerry Kagi (12:16) and Melody Martinez (12:18).

"I felt really, really good in practice but I got to the race and I couldn't run right. For some reason, I couldn't get into a stride pattern or anything, Coull-Parenty said. "It kind of bothers me that I didn't (win). My goal was to win all of the invitationals. Hopefully, FII just try and work and get the other ones."

rika Coull-Parenty is a weirdo. That's her word, and there are some who would agree with her.

Hinsdale South's cross country boys, for instance. They hassle her on

guys.
"They're so immature, so annoying," she said, laughing. "The seniors are very mean. They sit in the back of the bus, taking up all the room and acting like they're so cool while the rest of us have to triple up in the seats.

The senior Hornet boys might say the same about the 5-2, 95-pound Erika, but in truth they know their classmate may be the best female runner the school's ever had, and that includes Eileen Slowikowski.

She runs on highoctane emotions. and that's why they like to tease her. They're looking for a reaction, and they get it. "I give it right back," she said

Coull-Parenty probably is the most emotional athlete the school's ever had. You name it, she's done it.

She giggles, she cries, she worries. She gets mad and she gets even.

She's a team runner and she's a "Like I said, I'm a weirdo," she said. You have to be

weird to run. It's so boring. If you don't do something to get your mind off it, you'll go crazy."

Crying is what Erika does best. She gets so strung up before a big meet that tears overflow

their banks and follow paths down her face. It happened before a state event last year when coach Mike Madsen stood at the starting line with her until the last moment, then said, "OK, I'm going to leave now."

before. Racing won't end with high school. She'll race through college with a double major in psychology and English with poetry on the side (some of her works have been published in the Library of

Poetry). Don't be surprised to find Erika racing after college, too. Her dream - no, her goal - is to be in Sydney, Australia, in 2000 for the Olympic Games.

"I can do it; I know I can," she said.

And if she does, she'll remember all the places she ran -Fairview grade school, Eisenhower Junior High, Hinsdale South, England, Spain.

She'll remember, too, all the people who helped and encouraged her — Madsen, Joellen Camden, Nancy


"I ran better in the meet than I did all week in practice," Gruberman said.

# Hornets' Coull-Parenty savors win

Hinsdale South senior cross country runner Erika Coull-Parenty settled a long score by the first 100 yards Saturday.

With a quick dash right from the starting gun, Coull-Parenty grabbed a lead she never would relinquish in winning the Reavis Invitational.

Coull-Parenty not only was pleased after taking fourth at the Hornet/Red Devil Invitational Sept. 7 but Saturday's five-second victory in 12 minutes, 13 seconds for 2.0 miles marked the two-time all-stater's first varsity title over a full invitational field.

"Getting four girls in the top 20, we haven't had anything like that in a big invitational for many, many years so that was very exciting stuff," Hinsdale South coach Mike Madsen said.

In 1995, Coull-Parenty finished 20th in Class AA but her only invitational win was the No. 1 flight at the Minooka Invitational. Her toughest competition Saturday came from three other 1995 state qualifiers — Conant junior Jacquie Gallaway and Sandburg's Carrie Wojcik (12:20) and Sue Anderson (12:21).

# Hornets cheer first victory over Downers South

The smiling faces of the Hinsdale South girls cross country runners gathered around coach Mike Madsen for his victory speech after a job well done Monday at Katherine Legge Memorial Park in Hinsdale.

The screaming soon followed.

The Hornets didn't just defeat Downers Grove South 23-32 in West Suburban Conference Gold Division dual action.

The varsity victory was the Hornets' first over Downers South since the program started back in 1979. The Mustangs had won or shared 13 consecutive conference titles before finishing a strong second to Willowbrook the past two years.

"We were so ready for this meet," said Hinsdale South senior Christy Culen, a fourth-year varsity runner. "We know this team is a lot better than we have been in the past. I think being so anxious and knowing we could do so good, we just went out there and did what we had to."

Senior Erika Coull-Parenty easily won the race in 11 minutes, 52 seconds — her personal-best KLM time by 10 seconds. Senior Dalia Wenckus (12:19) finished second, followed by senior Jamie Bechina (fourth, 13:03), Culen (sixth, 13:11), senior Katie Moss (10th, 13:28), and sophomores Missy Veronica (11th, 13:30) and Joni Ranchero (15th, 13:55). The Hornets also defeated Leyden 15-49.

Every year since 1979, the Hornets (3-0 in WSC Gold) have finished among the top three teams in their conference but have never won a title.

The team still has a long way to go. The overall conference title is a 50-50 combination of dual-meet results and the Oct. 19 conference meet. And the Hornets still must race against Willowbrook in a Monday, Sept. 30, triangular at Addison Trail.

"I'm really excited right now," Hinsdale South coach Mike Madsen said. "We're really looking forward to being in that position, to have a shot at the conference. We got over our first big hurdle, but an even bigger one is up next Monday. But this can't hurt our confidence any."

On Saturday, the Hornets captured the Minooka Invitational, which features races in seven flights with

each runner's finish combined for the team score. With top-four finishes in every flight, the Hornets (18 points) won by five points over Herscher, fourth in Class A last year.

Wenckus (12:14 at No. 2 flight) and Culen (13:08 at No. 3) each took first place in their flights.

Coull-Parenty (11:50 at No. 1) and Ranchero (14:16 at No. 7) were second and Bechina (13:20 at No. 4), Moss (13:48 at No. 5) and Anna Kumis (14:19 at No. 6) were fourth. Purva Kelkar was fifth in the open race (14:17).

Coull-Parenty broke her 1995 course record by 12 seconds but finished 20 seconds behind Elgin freshman Lupe Flores.

Wenckus won her flight convincingly. Culen, who won by seconds, decided Friday she'd compete after battling an ear infection and cold all week.

"I was definitely ready to run," said Culen, third in the No. 5 flight last year in 13:48. "Minooka has always been my favorite race because it gives everyone a chance to stand out for themselves."

# Hornets' Coull-Parenty wins race, but Willowbrook prevails

Ten minutes after Ericka Coull-Parenty of Hinsdale South won Monday at Centennial Park in Addison, she still was fighting back tears.

Dual meets count in the West Suburban Gold Conference.

The senior cried because Willowbrook had edged the Hornets 26-29 and holds an advantage at the WSGC meet in two weeks. A combination of dual and conference meet results determine the champion.

"Last week we beat Downers Grove South for the first time and we wanted to come close to Willowbrook, if not win," Coull-Parenty said, "It really meant a lot. It's our senior year for most of us and we really wanted to win for coach (Mike Madsen)."

Hinsdale South beat Addison Trail 15-49 and Willowbook defeated the Blazers 15-50 in girls competition.

"They were the ones I was most concerned about," Willowbrook coach Margo Miller said. "We let them set the pace. We didn't have a good county meet, so I didn't know what to expect, but we kept going at it."

Willowbrook won with big assists from underclassmen. Sophomore Liana Bracker was fifth (13:08), sophomore Jessica Rodenbostel sixth (13:14) and freshman Maggie Granrath (13:23) ran eighth in her

first varsity meet.

"Liana's the heartbreak kid, she starts at the back and moves up," Miller said. "I've been watching Maggie get better and better."

The young Warriors were led by freshman Jenny Goebel (third in 12:35) and senior Julie Rauch (fourth in 12:56).

"We're running pretty well as a team, but we can run better," Goebel said. "They started out way faster than us. Next time, we've got to be ready for that."

Coull-Parenty, 20th at last year's AA state meet, breezed through the mile in 5:44 and finished the 2.3-mile course in a swift 12:08. Teammate Dalia Wenckus was second in 12:26.

Surprising Missy Veronica, a recently promoted sophomore, was seventh in 13:17. Katie Moss (9th) and Christy Culen rounded out the top 10

Hinsdale South could claim a cochampionship by winning the WSC Gold meet. South has never won. Willowbrook has taken 3 of the last

"We've waited a long time to be in position to challenge for the title," Madsen said. "With a quarter-mile to go, we were leading by a point. They came through when they needed to."

Addison Trail was led by senior Jennifer Slawson (14th) and freshman Manali Patel (16th).

"We've really been snakebit," Blazers coach Chuck Morgan said.

■ Hinsdale South's boys also are chasing a WSC Gold title. Monday's double victory (21-36 over Willowbrook and 15-50 over Addison Trail) could aid their efforts to catch Morton.

Despite all of the things that hindered the Hinsdale South girls cross country team at Saturday's Niles West Invitational, the Homets continued their tradition of coming away with another big trophy by finishing fifth in the Red Division with 170 points.

Senior Erika Coull-Parenty led Hinsdale South by taking third in 11 minutes, 53 seconds — the highest Illinois finisher in the division — followed by Dalia Wenckus (5th, 12:08), Christy Culen (39th, 13:02), Jamie Bechina (63rd, 13:25), Missy Veronica (64th, 13:27) and Katie Moss (67th, 13:32).

With area teams hitting the trail in search of conference hardware this weekend, here's a rundown on who to watch at which league meets ...

DuPage Valley

Girls race: To date, Glenbard North has the better threesome. Since the Falcon Classic, it's easy to concede that Wheaton Warrenville South is stronger from first to fifth. But which has the best top four?

(11's an intriguing question, and one that probably won't be answered definitively at Saturday's DuPage Valley Conference meet. It defies an answer, which is why the battle between Wheaton South and Glenbard North promises to be interest-

ing.
The teams have switched off at the third and fourth spots in the Herald poll all season.

Glenbard North could have Bry Houdek, Emily Ilg and Andrea Boye among the top 10 at Reed-Keppler Park in West Chicago (10 a.m.) and not defend its 1995 title. South could run its usual solid 1-5 race and finish second.

"From the girls' standpoint, it's the foughest conference meet," said Glenbard North coach Bud Swanson. "If you look at the state rankings, Naperville North is in the top 10 or 11. It should be interesting. You never know in our conference."

Wheaton Warrenville South may rate a slight edge because the Tigers beat Glenbard North in a dual and finished higher (third) at the Falcon Classic. The Panthers fared better at the DuPage County Meet and would have been ahead of Wheaton Warrenville South at the Falcon if only the top five scores counted instead of

Actually, if Naperville North runs to its potential, neither of the cofavorites may claim the first-place trophy. The unknown factor with all three teams is how much each has improved in the last week.

"South has a great little pack. If they have three or four in the top 10, we're in trouble," Swanson said. "We're closing our gaps. As Emily closed the gap between her and Bry,

our fifth and sixth runners got closer,

Individually, Houdek is the favorite to reclaim the title she won in 1994. Based on recent performances, Ilg could finish second. That might give Glenbard North a huge advantage, if Wheaton Warrenville South's Kerri Kagi weren't a strong candidate for third

Other top runners include Jenny Wallrab and Amy Silder of Naperville North, Melody Martinez and Jenny Graham of Wheaton Warrenville South and Kelly Kennedy of Glenbard East.

Newly healthy Naperville Central, Wheaton North, Glenbard East and West Chicago could finish anywhere from third to seventh.

Boys race: Fans often miss the best and/or most important parts of cross country races. If you're at Saturday's DuPage Valley Conference Meet (10 a.m. at Reed-Keppler Park in West Chicago), watch the No. 3 runners.

If there's common denominators between top teams Glenbard North, Naperville North and Naperville Central, it's that they're third-best runners could hold the key to a DVC title. In each case, the top two spots are manned by consistent runners and the next has been hit with injuries or illness.

"I think between us and Central, our fours and fives will be very close," Naperville North coach Dave Racey said. "The key will probably be how much somebody's No. 3 can beat

our No. 3 by."



After three second-place finishes, Hinsdale South senior cross country runner Erika Coull-Parenty finally achieved her goal of a conference title Saturday.

The Hornets weren't as fortunate.

Those hopes for a first overall crown were thwarted by an equally inspired Willowbrook, which beat the Hornets 32-46 to win the West Suburban Conference Gold Division Meet and with it the overall title at Centennial Park in Addison.

The overall title is a 50-50 combination of dual meet and conference meet results. Since the Hornets, Willowbrook and Downers Grove South (3rd, 49 points), all went 5-1 in duals, Saturday's results meant the winner took all.

"I know (our girls) wanted to win. No question about that," Hinsdale South coach Mike Madsen said. "If anything, what makes us feel better was Willowbrook ran really well. Even if we had been at our best, we would have been hard-pressed to make up 14 points."

A three-time state meet qualifier, Coull-Parenty posted a career-best split (11 minutes 42 seconds over 2.03 miles) to win the race by 39 seconds after finishing second the past three years to Willowbrook's Christine Mueller, now running

at Purdue University.

Coull-Parenty, who beat her career-best 2.0-mile time by 10 seconds, joins Eileen Slowikowski (1983) as the only Hornets to earn individual conference titles.

13:04) earned All-WSC Gold honors by finishing among the top 16. Senior Katie Moss finished 17th (13:22) for the second time in three years, followed by senior Jamie Bechina (22nd, 13:35) and sophomore Anna Kumis (24th, 13:38).

All seven of the Hornets' times at Centennial Park were better than when Willowbrook beat the Hornets 26-29 in their triangular with Addison Trail Sept. 30.

"From what had happened in all of the conference (duals), I hoped (getting second) would happen," said Wenckus, who beat her Sept. 30 time by five seconds. "I didn't feel that good and fast in that race. I just felt that I had to keep pace and keep going because I was by myself."

Veronica, a varsity track runner in 1995, has emerged as one of the Hornets' top runners despite being sidetracked by shin splints.

"I was pretty excited. I didn't run cross country last year so I didn't think I was going to do as well as I did," Veronica said.



### South seniors enjoy best of times in regional race

Hinsdale South seniors Erika Coull-Parenty and Dalia Wenckus shattered their previous best times at Katherine Legge Memorial Park Saturday in the Hinsdale Central Regional and still had plenty of energy left afterwards.

Moments after the pair earned top-six finishes on the 2.0-mile home course, they were celebrating their accomplishments and the Hornets' fifth-place team

finish with friends and well-wishers.

"It felt good and it didn't even feel hard. It just felt nice and smooth," said Wenckus, a first-year cross country runner who bettered her previous best KLM time by 17 seconds. "I'll have to make it uncomfortable for myself (at sectionals) and run a little bit faster. I know that this is only the beginning."

Thanks to their top-five finish, the Hornets (110 points) qualified as a team for the East Aurora Sectional at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 2, at Phillips

Park in Aurora.

Coull-Parenty finished third in a frenzied battle at the finish line in 11 minutes 34 seconds, just shy of Eileen Slowikowski's 11:33.3 school-record KLM time set in 1983. Wenckus is now third on that list with her 12:03 for sixth.

Senior Jamie Bechina (32nd, 13:05), the Hornets' No. 3 finisher, led a strong pack followed by sophomore Missy Veronica (33rd, 13:07), senior Christy Culen (36th, 13:10), sophomore Anjali Iyengar (37th, 13:11) and senior Katie Moss (39th, 13:18).

"Everybody either had their best time or close to their best time. And our No. 3 through 7 girls stayed within 13 seconds of each other," Hinsdale South

everybody run a really good race (at sectionals) and see what it gets us."

The 5-foot-2 Coull-Parenty appeared destined for fourth but put on a burst and got between Downers Grove North's Elizabeth Tumpach (11:33) and Benet's Sarah McCullough (11:34) at the chute. Benet's Lissy Vogley won in 11:29.

"While I was running, I'm thinking, 'This is the best finish. People are going to remember this,' "Coull-Parenty said. "I wanted to scoot right in between and hopefully get both of them. I got one of

them but it was a lot of push and shove."

Being so close to Slowikowski's time, though, was the bigger accomplishment. Slowikowski, an all-state runner (top-25 at state meet) and now the cross country coach at Grant High School, has often inspired Coull-Parenty in cross country and track.


"It was such a privilege to meet (Slowikowski) because her times are No. 1 in everything (at Hinsdale South)," said Coull-Parenty, already a two-time all-stater. "Other years I wouldn't have even imagined getting close to Eileen's time. I'm glad that I had Dalia to push me the whole season. Otherwise, I wouldn't have done so well."

Wenckus excelled by focusing on the fifth-place battle between Benet's Katie Brininger and Lyons Township's Katie Ireland. Brininger took fifth in 11:53 while Ireland dropped out after the 1-mile mark.

"I was just in a zone," Wenckus said. "(Brininger) got kind of far away from me, but I saw her up there and let her pull me along."

The top five teams at sectionals and the seven fastest individuals not among those teams qualify for the state meet Nov. 9 at Peoria's Detweiller Park. With the state's most powerful sectional field again at East Aurora, team and individual berths will be at a premium.

Asthma, injuries and just plain nervousness - Hinsdale South senior girls cross country runner Erika Coull-Parenty has overcome it all to reach the state meet.

This time, the only barrier from becoming the first four-time state qualifier in school history was all in her head.

Coull-Parenty fought off the pain of a slight concussion suffered earlier in the week and finished an impressive fourth among another powerful field Saturday at the Class AA East Aurora Sectional at Phillips Park in Aurora.

Coull-Parenty, who covered the 2.25-mile course in 13 minutes 17 seconds, and senior Dalia Wenckus (12th, 13:42), a first-year cross country runner, advanced by being among the sectional's seven highest finishing individuals not among the five qualifying teams. The Class AA girls race is at 11:30 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 9, at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

"I was surprised I did that well for still having a slight concussion because when you're running with

that, your brain just feels like soup," said Coull-Parenty. who seeks a top-five state finish after being 20th twice. "I'm just looking to (state). It's my senior year and I want it to be memorable."

Led by their senior duo, the Hornets took 10th (262 points) in arguably the state's deepest sectional field. They ahead finished Willowbrook (14th, 339), which beat them for the West Suburban Conference Gold Division title, and Hinsdale Central (13th, 293), which beat them at the Oct. 26 Hinsdale Central Regional.

"We ran very, very, well today. And this is such a tough sectional," Hinsdale Wenckus South coach Mike Madsen said. "This is almost like a state meet in itself with all of the

competition you have here."

Seven of the sectional's top 10 finishers from 1995 were back Saturday, three of whom were top-15 in last year's state meet and three others among the top 45. Yet Coull-Parenty held her own despite her concussion from colliding with a teammate in the

dark after toilet-papering assistant coach Donna Ardito's house after regionals and missing practice for two days.

Coull-Parenty was 22 seconds ahead of her 1993 sectional time — her last appearance at East Aurora - and within range of Geneva freshman Rebecca Mitchell (12:56) and St. Charles sophomore Tera Moody (13:02), who along with Bloomington's Christin Wurth are heavy state title favorites. Downers Grove North's Liz Tumpach was third (13:11) and Benet's Lissa Vogley fifth (13:19).

"Just knowing that (Vogley) won our regional and I beat her made me feel really good because I know

that I improved," Coull-Parenty said. "I've definitely been on edge all week. I was so nervous because I knew what schools were coming. I knew I had to run harder than I have this whole season."

Other than freshmen, Wenckus is the Hornets' first first-year runner to qualify for state. Wenckus does have

state meet experience and all-state credentials, though, as a track standout in 1995 and 1993.

"Track is just so nerve-wracking because you have to prepare yourself for one event and then save yourself for another. (Cross country) is just one race, you focus, and so it's a lot of fun," Wenckus said

"It feels awesome. I haven't had much time to think about the sectional so maybe that's good for me. Finally this weekend it hit me, it's sectionals. I've got to run fast."

For the second straight meet, senior Jamie Bechina (63rd, 14:36) was the Hornets' No. 3 runner, followed by senior Christy Culen (106th, 15:07), sophomore Missy Veronica (107th, 15:07), senior Katie Moss (113th, 15:12) and sophomore Anjali Iyengar (125th, 15:26).

"I just knew it was probably going to be my last cross country race and I wanted to see what I could do," said Bechina, a second-year cross country runner. "I tried to get up to the front and keep up as best as I can. It went pretty well."

### Runners head into state after solid sectional performance

The biting cold of late October and early November could not stop the girls crosscountry team from finishing in strong fashion.

The Hornets, who had finished a disappointing second in the conference meet, came on with solid efforts in the regional and sectional

meets. Seniors Erika Coull-Parenty and Dalia Wenckus both had tremendous individual races at sectionals to qualify for the state meet. The state meet will be held on November 9.

At the regional meet held at Katherine Legge Memorial Park, the Hornets qualified for the sectional meet as a team by finishing fifth overall. Coull-Parenty and Wenckus both smashed their home course personal bests with times of 11:34 and 12:03, respectively.

Coull-Parenty barely missed breaking Eileen Slowikowski's school record time of 11:33.3 at Katherine Legge.

At sectionals, the Hornets placed tenth out of fifteen teams.

The duo of Coull-Parenty (4th) and Wenckus (12th)

again led the Hornets by individually qualifying for the state cross-country meet.

Both Coull-Parenty and Wenckus have high goals for themselves.

Coull-Parenty, a two-time All-Stater, said, "Since I have been there before, I would like to place in the top 7."

Wenckus added, "I would like to run well, and hopefully be in the top 25 (All-State)."

## Coull-Parenty runs gamut of emotions

Hinsdale South's Erika Coull-Parenty was feeling a wave of emotions after the state cross country meet Saturday at Detweiller Park in Peoria.

The senior had just capped a brilliant prep cross country

career with an 11th-place finish in 12:07.

"I'm crying because it's been so much fun," Coull-Parenty said. "It was the best time of my life and I really don't want it to end. I'll never forget every moment I had.

"This season was wonderful and memorable for me because it was my last. That was my theme this year. This was my last year and I had to make the most of it in every way possible."

Three weeks ago, Coull-Parenty won the West Suburban Conference Gold Division meet. She was with the leaders Saturday until the final half-mile.

"I was right there, until the very end, unfortunately," Coull-Parenty said.

She was 20th in the state as a freshman and junior and 129th as a sophomore two years ago.

"I'm still kind of disappointed, because it was not what I wanted," said Coull-Parenty, who was shooting for a top seven finish. "But I'm slowly starting to feel good about my place."

Teammate Dalia Wenckus, in her first year of cross country,

finished 51st in 12:40.

Wenckus, who will run two track events in the spring, got off

to a good start.
"I ran through the mile faster than I usually do and I just had

to keep on going," Wenckus said.

"It was great to have somebody down here with me to feel
the same things that I was feeling and to go through the same
things that I was going through," said Coull-Parenty, who finished fourth at the East Aurora sectional last week.
