## Hornet harriers run to win the division opener

The Hinsdale South girls' cross country team and its top runner, Leigh Krietsch, got their West Suburban Conference Gold Division season off on the right foot Monday, with a 23-34 victory over Morton at Katherine Legge Memorial Park in Hinsdale.

Krietsch, a junior, captured her first career win by running the 2-mile course in a personal-best 13 minutes 12 seconds.

"She's just really beginning to come into her own," Hinsdale South coach Mike Madsen said. "She came on strong in track last year, and she's continuing that in cross country. She really went after the win today."

Krietsch was followed by teammates Rana Kreterfield (third, 14:29), Carlie Buenger (fourth, 14:38), Sarah Luetkemeyer (seventh, 15:04), Louise Nekola (eighth, 15:16), Sue Saxinger (ninth, 15:21) and Lori Lazansky (13th, 15:48).

"We were very pleased to get off to

a good start (in the conference)," Madsen said. "It seems, in recent years, that we've been in the top three in the conference. We're hoping to be up there again, and this is one of the key meets (to get there)."

The Hornets finished seventh at the 18-team Reavis Invitational Saturday with 223 points, edging eighth-place Reavis (228), which had nipped Hinsdale South a week earlier at the Hornet-Red Devils Invitational.

Krietsch turned in the Hornets' top finish, taking seventh in 14:42 on the 2.25-mile course. She was followed by Buenger (43rd, 15:58), Saxinger (52nd, 16:14), Kreterfield (53rd, 16:16), Nekola (58th, 16:27), Luetkemeyer (59th, 16:28) and Glynda Davidson (65th, 16:46).
